# What is at Stake?

The Rivanna River provides our community with drinking water, recreational opportunities, animal and plant habitats, industrial and household uses and aesthetic enjoyment. Overuse of and increasing pollution to the Rivanna River led a group of concerned citizens to create the Rivanna Conservation Society in 1990.

Problem Statement: Human activities within the Rivanna River Basin are increasing pressure on the environment and natural habitat. Rainwater runoff carries pollution from roads, parking lots, homes, and commecial structures, farmland (including fertlizers and pesticides) into the waterways. Paved surfaces and development generally increase sediment flow into the river, altering its characteristics and imperiling its habitats.

Erosion and sedimentation are among the major threats to the health of the beautiful Rivanna River and its tributaries.

**Priorities:** The Rivanna Conservation Society is comited to the protection and enhancement of the Rivanna River Basin's water quality and water quantity.


**Mission:** The RCS mission is to safeguard the ecological, recreational, cultural, scenic, and historic resources of the Rivanna River Watershed.

#### The Rivanna



The Rivanna River begins in the Blude Ridge Mountains of Albemarle and Greene Counties. traverses Charlottesville and Albemarle, Louisa

and Orange Counties, joining the James River after flowing through Fluvanna County. This tranquil and beautiful river is home to hundreds of species of native plant and animal life. Although many rivers across Virginia have been severely polluted or have lost much of their original wildlife habitats, the Rivanna has remained one of the few relatively untouched by development.

### What We Do

The Rivanna Conservation Scoiety aims to proect the largely unspoiled beauty of the river



and to maintain a healthy

ecosystem throughout the river's watershed. We work with local communities to educate school children, teachers, government officials, and the general public about the ecological threats to the Rivanna River.

RCS is governed by a Board of Directors, employs a small professional staff, and has four standing committees.







# The Scheier Natural Area

In 1997, the Scheier Natural Area, a 100 acre parcel of land in Fluvanna County, was donated to the Rivanna Conservation Society as a protected area for biological, wildlife,



and aquatic habitats. The Scheier Natural Area offers eight ponds and over three miles of beautiful trails for hiking, enjoying nature, and environmental education. Scheier is free and open to the public

### Initiatives

In the spring, the Go X-Stream Rivanna River Makeover will incorporate stream cleanups, buffers plantings, and other restoration projects. The River Guardians program has volunteers that monitor the quality of the streams, document pollution and erosion problems, and identify areas in need of protection or restoration. The RCS River Steward program is the eyes and ears of the Rivanna River, and serves as an on-the-water advocate for conservation and responsible stewardship.
