The Rivanna River originates in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Albemarle and Greene Counties. It traverses the City of Charlottesville and the counties of Albemarle, Louisa, and Fluvanna before it joins with the James River in Columbia, VA. This tranquil and beautiful river, often referred to as Mr. Jefferson's River, is home to hundreds of native plants and animal species.

What We Do

The Rivanna Conservation Society (RCS) aims to protect the largely unspoiled beauty of the river and to maintain a healthy ecosystem throughout the river's watershed. We work with local communities to educate school children, teachers, government officials and the general public about the ecological threats to the Rivanna River.

What's At Stake

Human activities within the Rivanna River basin are increasing pressure on the environment and natural Rainwater runoff carries habitat. pollution from roads, parking lots, homes, commercial structures, and (including fertilizers & farmland pesticides) into the waterways. Paved surfaces and development generally increase sediment flows into the river, altering characteristics and imperiling habitats.

Erosion and sedimentation are among the major threats to the health and quality of the Rivanna and its tributaries.
