Land Use:

Starts at 29 corridor as commercial use, then residential use along Polo Grounds Rd, next is open space, and then Penn Park & Darden Towe Park.

Wildlife Sightings and Plant Life:

Turtles, Hawk, Butterflies, Tree Swallows, Crow, Vultures, Smaller Fish jumping out of the water, Groundhog, Deer, 3 Eagles, Cardinal, Geese, Ducks, and Woodpecker. Some flowering colors along banks, vegetation getting greener and denser after recent rains we have gotten.

People Interactions:

Rivanna River Company (RRC) shuttled us and provided the kayaks for our paddle today. Only saw a couple of people fishing in Darden Towe, people walking along the trails, and 1 person at the Darden Towe boat ramp.

Litter and Pollution:

Collected ½ bag of small trash. Larger trash items also (1 tire, abandoned bicycles, railroad bridge trash, piece of a car, and sheet metal object).

Overall Summary:

This was our scouting paddle for the Spring Sojourn Cleanup Paddle coming up on Sunday this week. Water levels and flows were extremely high today, but it actually made for a smooth paddle. A lot of good wildlife seen, and a lot of large trash items to look into removing this year.

Actions Needed – level of priority (1 highest/5 lowest):

- 3 Remove the rest of the small trash;
- 3 Remove larger items (railroad scrap, car, tree, and sheet metal)
