We partnered with Rivanna River Company to provide this educational paddle opportunity. 11 children (ages 8-11) and 4 staff from Boys and Girls Club paddled today. We started at the UVA dock and paddled towards the Dam, and then finished at the UVA dock. There were also several rowers out on the Reservoir today.
