Many of the children (elementary school age) had never been in a boat on the water before. We started at the UVA Boathouse dock and did an out and back paddle towards the Dam, and then headed back to the UVA Boathouse dock. There were also a significant amount of other people out in boats today, including kayaks, fishing boats, and rowers.

There was only 1 or 2 pieces of small trash found today.

It was a very successful paddle / event today and everyone had a good time. The water levels were decent even with the recent dry period we have been experiencing. All the participants got to learn about some of the work RCA does and why we try to keep our water healthy and clean.
