Land Use:

Residential mainly along the banks of the Reservoir, with some private commercial properties as well, such as Cornerstone Community Church.

Wildlife Sightings and Plant Life:

Turtles, Fish, Ducks, Geese, Osprey or Hawk, Butterflies, Dragonflies. Vegetation was still very green and lush along the banks.

People Interactions:

There were a lot of people out on the Reservoir this morning. There were several rowing teams practicing, and some recreational boaters (kayaks, rowers, and fishing boats). There were also several people fishing at the Woodlands Rd bridge. Overall I probably saw about 40 people out there.

Litter and Pollution:

There was only 1 or 2 pieces of small trash found today in the Reservoir, but there ½ a large trash bag worth or litter picked up from the Woodlands Rd Boat Ramp area from people who had left their fishing trash behind. There was also a significant green tint to the water from algae growth.

Overall Summary:

The most noticeable thing from today's paddle was the green color and murky film on the surface of the Reservoir (mostly in the UVA Boathouse and Woodlands Rd / Earlysville Rd areas, it got better as you paddle towards the Dam. Glad to see so many people out on a nice morning.

Actions Needed – level of priority (1 highest/5 lowest):

3 - Woodlands Rd Ramp area needs attention, road is in terrible shape, and typically a lot of trash found there (even with a trash can present).
