## **Swiftwater Rescue Class Summary:**

This report summarizes the Swiftwater Rescue training class (ACA Level 3 River Safety and Rescue) that was held at Lewis & Clark Exploratory Center in Darden Towe Park. The class was taught by Jamie Beadle from Lake Monticello Water Rescue Team. We had participants from The Rivanna Conservation Alliance, The Rivanna River Company, Lewis & Clark Exploratory Center, Great Outdoor Provisions Co., and The Albemarle County Fire and Rescue Team. Due to the high water levels and fast moving current in the Rivanna River today, we were unable to complete the on the water portion of the training class, but we did cover the following topics: understanding the Swiftwater environment; river trip planning to reduce the risk of injuries and rescues; liability; developing key self-rescue skills; identifying and avoiding river hazards by understanding hydrology, hazards, and river features; throwing rescue ropes; equipment checks and discussion; boat pins and basic mechanical advantage

## **River Conditions:**

The Rivanna River was up extremely high and moving extremely fast today due to the heavy rains we had yesterday. The water was a brownish color from all the sediment. We watched as giant trees and logs were carrying downstream. The water levels were up into the parking lot at Darden Towe and we could see the water coming up further as we stood there, almost as if there was a tide to the River.
