Starting Location and Time: Rio Mills Rd Below the Dam (10:30 AM)

Ending Location and Time: Free Bridge (2:00 PM)

Land Use:

Starts at 29 corridor as commercial use, then residential use along Polo Grounds Rd, next is open space, and then Penn Park & Darden Towe Park.

Wildlife Sightings and Plant Life:

Turtles, Hawk, Butterflies, Water Snake, River Otter, Tree Swallows, Crow, Osprey, 4 Great Blue Herons, 2 Long Nose Gar, Smaller Fish jumping out of the water, Caterpillars, Groundhog, Deer, Dragonflies. Lots of Mimosa flowers seen today, a few orange Lilies, some Bamboo and other invasives.

People Interactions:

Gabe Silver from Rivanna River Company (RRC) was kind enough to shuttle us and provide the kayaks for our paddle today. It was the start of our partnership to offer RRC/RCA guided paddles this summer on the Rivanna. We also saw 2 other people kayaking fishing, 2 people fishing at Darden Towe, and about 10 people tubing on the Rivanna today.

Litter and Pollution:

Only a few bottles and cans were found today, and lots of buried tires.

Overall Summary:

Water levels and weather were perfect for the paddle today. Lots of wildlife seen, and generally this stretch of the Rivanna looked in good shape.

Actions Needed – level of priority (1 highest/5 lowest):

4 – consider removing some of the buried tires from the River
