Residential mainly, with some commercial use and park property

Wildlife Sightings and Plant Life:

Turtles, Swallows, Green Heron, Great Blue Heron, Fish, Cat, Dragonflies, Spiders, Eagle. Very green and thick vegetation along the banks. Several large downed trees from recent storms, but none causing safety hazards.

People Interactions:

We saw a couple of other people out kayaking and Stand Up Paddleboarding today on the Rivanna River. RCA was accompanied on this paddle by 4 members of the Albemarle County Water Rescue Team (Matt Ascoli, Todd Southard, Gerald Perry, and Cody Main).

Litter and Pollution:

Collected 1.5 bags of trash, mostly comprised of plastic and glass bottles, but also some sports balls, a bucket, a cooler, and some Styrofoam.

Overall Summary:

It ended up being a nice day for a paddle with the cloud cover overhead, and the water levels still just high enough to avoid scraping the boats on too many rocks. RCA was showing the Albemarle County Water Rescue Team some of what we do and what we look for during our paddles on the Rivanna. We plan to do several more paddles together in the near future.
