
Project Description:

The Rivanna Conservation Alliance and Ecosystem Services have partnered together to create the Rivanna Prioritization Study and Capacity Building Project. The overall goal of the project is to prioritize restoration work along the main stem of the Rivanna River corridor from the confluence of the North and South Fork to Moores Creek. The project is funded through the NFWF Technical Assistance (TA) Grant Program. Project work will get underway in October 2019 and run through September 2020.

Primary Methods:

Assessment work will include a field-based drone survey and development of a multicriterion decision analysis (MCDA) tool to score and rank potential projects. A conceptual design and engineer's cost estimate will be created for the highest ranked project.
