

RIVANNA RIVER STEWARD REPORT

Starting Location and Time: Reas Ford Bridge (1:00 PM)

Ending Location and Time: UVA Boat Dock (3:00 PM)

Weather: Clear skies Recent Precipitation: Rainfall for the week was <1"

Land Use:

The area along this stretch is held by private landowners as well as the City of Charlottesville. It is kept wooded for the most part with a few exceptions on the reservoir where residents have installed residential lawns down to the water.

Wildlife Sightings and Plant Life:

Great blue herons, turtles, osprey, fish, deer, ducks, and large gatherings of geese.

People Interactions:

Several kayakers were out paddling and fishing.

Litter and Pollution:

We saw a lot of litter where we put in along Reas Ford Rd. A road paving project was occurring on the road and equipment and trucks were parked in that area.

We found styrofoam bait boxes and beer cans just below the Reas Ford bridge put in.

Hazards:

We observed that the downed utility line we reported from our 3/26/20 paddle was still in the reservoir. The utility company was working in the area, but we were unable to determine if they were working to remove the line from the water.



Overall Summary:

The paddle was slow as there is not much flow to the SF Rivanna on this stretch due to the reservoir. We had great wildlife sightings of blue herons hunting for fish. We saw one catch and swallow a ~5" fish. The plants and trees have leafed out, adding some shade along the edges of the water. A few community members were out enjoying the natural beauty of the river and the solitude that day.

Actions Needed – level of priority (1 highest/5 lowest):




Figure 1: Albemarle County GIS shows water protection buffers and conservation easements. Stars indicate starting and ending points.




Figure 3: Reservoir slows the water




Figure 7: Utility company seen working near downed line previously reported and still in the water.
